

All of Reading is invited to take a walk, bike, hike or run and explore your town. Sponsored by Reading Trails Committee, Walkable Reading and Reading Open Land Trust, Walk Reading Weekend promotes the exploration of Reading.

All you need to do to participate in Walk Reading Weekend is First, put on something **red** – a **scarf**, a **shirt**, a **belt**, a **sash**, a **ribbon**, or **anything red** - and step out of your door and enjoy and explore Reading by foot or by bike.

- 11:00 AM from the end of Pasture Road for a hike in the Sledge Woods/Kurchian Woods conservation areas.
- 1:00 PM meeting at the parking area for Pinevale Conservation on Pinevale Avenue.
