New Year Greetings from Town Manager Bob LeLacheur



A short six months ago I took my first steps along the path forged by the Town's legendary first Town Manager, Peter Hechenbleikner. Of course, I knew I had plenty of help because of the very strong organization walking by my side. In early July our Selectmen established a series of 31 goals for the next year, and the first one was to examine that organization built over Peter's twenty six years and re-direct it as needed into the future. We began to look introspectively within and prospectively ahead, and a plan was formed to shift the focus over time to a more proactive than reactive stance in the delivery of services within the community.

The recent conclusion of November Town Meeting has rearranged some of your Town government to begin to achieve this goal. First, Recreation has moved from the Public Works department to the Community Services department where serving the community through their programming will benefit residents of all ages. Recreation facilities, the envy of most area cities and towns, will continue to be maintained by the DPW. The Community Services department will be led by one of the two Assistant Town Managers who will serve as a liaison to the community, especially in our important community and economic development efforts.

Second, Town Meeting combined and reorganized three departments into two, as seen below:

The old Finance department began as a small office handling Payroll and Human Resources, but over time had grown significantly. The new Finance department retains the pure finance divisions of assessing property, collecting taxes and other payments, and serving as the Treasury function for the Town, Schools, and Light Department, and combines them with the Accounting function. The new Finance department will be led by the Town Accountant who will also serve as Finance Director.

A new Administrative Services department (ASD) has been created to serve the entire organization. ASD includes the Town Manager's Office as well as the remaining old Finance divisions of Technology, Human Resources, and the Town Clerk's Office. This department will be led by a soon to

be filled Assistant Town Manager position, established to promote internal efficiency and an improved effort to communicate with our customers through enhanced technology.

Police, Fire, Public Works, and the Public Library will all have strengthened and integrated management teams, and each will continue to do their outstanding work in the community. An architect is currently fine tuning the Library building project and next spring we'll share those exciting updated designs!

The past six months have been very busy as we designed and planned for these changes. You should all be very proud, as I am, that we have an organization dedicated to providing the most cost-effective and top-notch customer service of any governmental organization. From all of your employees in Reading's Town government, we wish you a happy holiday season and a healthy and enjoyable new year!

Real Estate Taxes... Water/Sewer... Storm Water Bills... Electronic Payments...



Water/Sewer/Storm Water bills were mailed on December 10 & must be paid by 5:30 PM on January 15 in order to receive the 10% discount. No exceptions allowed so please plan ahead. Postmarks are not accepted. The white mail box in the parking lot will be emptied at 5:30 PM on January 15. Payments not received by January 31 accrue interest daily at an annual rate of 14% until payment is received.

The first installment of the FY14 Actual Real Estate/Personal Property tax bills will be in the mail by December 31. Payment is due by February 4. The tax rate approved by the Dept. of Revenue for FY14 is \$14.74. These bills reflect all payments made on the preliminary bills & any exemptions/abatements that were granted by December 15, 2013. The deadline to apply for abatements is February 4, the same as the bill due date. The deadline to apply for an exemption is 90 days from the date of mailing. The state mandated interest rate is 14% for late payments. Payments not received by the due date are subject to interest and demand fees.

Excise bills for vehicles registered or garaged in Reading as of December 31 will be mailed in late January or early February. These bills are due 30 days from the date they are mailed. The state mandated interest rate is 12% for late payments. Payments not received by the due date are subject to interest and demand fees.

The demand fee increased from \$5 to \$25 as of January 1, 2009 by vote of Town Meeting. Please note that effective January 1, 2014 we are no longer mailing reminder notices about late payments before imposing the demand fee on unpaid bills. Phone, email and text reminders are available to those that sign up for Reading Community Alerts. **Please watch for your bills and contact our office if you do not receive them.**

If you're using an on-line bill payment service through your bank please be sure that you allow plenty of time for your bank to **mail** a check to our office. Most banks require 7 – 10 business days to guarantee on-time payment. Also, please check that you have the proper bill number or account number referenced on your payment. Bill numbers change each cycle and are often not updated on your on-line bill payment checks. We do not receive electronic payments from your bank unless you use the link from our website. If you choose to use this link, you may pay up until the due date and your payment will be considered timely.

Reading Response Program



The Reading Response Program provides assistance to Reading residents with medically related services including transportation to medical appointments and paying for hospital services. The program is funded by the investment income on the Hospital Trust Funds. Financial guidelines do apply, with a sliding scale of co-pays for varying income levels. This is intended to be a supplemental program providing medically necessary assistance that is not covered under Medicare or private health insurance. Reading Police Department launches TEXT A TIP Android & iPhone app



The Reading Police Department is launching a new TEXT A TIP app for Android and iPhone devices that enable the public to send anonymous tips to the police and allows the police to respond back, creating a two way anonymous “chat.”

Developed by CitizenObserver, a St. Paul MN company, TEXT A TIP puts a powerful new crime fighting tool into the hands of our community for all ages and demographics. According to Chief James Cormier, this capability is a new paradigm for creating safer communities – especially in reaching out to a younger age demographic. “We’re proud to make this technology available to our citizens free of charge. This tool, along with our existing tip411 program, will help our citizens play an active role in keeping neighborhoods safer, and it will engage people of all ages in the process and save our agency time and resources.”

The TEXT A TIP app can be downloaded online at the Google Play store or iTunes by searching READINGPD TIPS.

Citizens can also send an anonymous tip to the Reading Police Department by texting the word READINGPD and their tip to 847411.

Since the tip411 program came to Reading in 2011, it has been an overwhelming success. Numerous tips have prevented crimes from occurring and helped solve many others. The Reading Police Department would like to thank everyone who has submitted tips in the past and encourage more in the future.

This process is 100% anonymous. CitizenObserver’s technology removes all identifying information before the police department can see it so there is no way to identify the sender.

CitizenObserver is a St. Paul, MN company founded in 2000 that provides web-based alerting tools to law enforcement, education, and public safety agencies in over 40 states.

SNOW & ICE REMOVAL

With winter weather here, the Department of Public Works would like to remind residents that their cooperation is needed to keep our streets clear and safe.

The Town of Reading's General Bylaws prohibit depositing snow or ice on a portion of any street or sidewalk that has been plowed or cleared for travel. Violation of this General Bylaw is punishable by a fine of up to \$300.

The owner of the property is responsible for the violation, even if it was done by a contractor hired by the owner or tenant of the property.

The Town appreciates your cooperation in our efforts to clear all the streets and the sidewalks in the school and business districts.



Christmas Tree Recycling



This January the Town is providing two options for recycling Christmas trees. On Saturday, January 18 residents may take their trees to the Compost Area on Strout Avenue from 8:00 AM to 2:30 PM (leaves and branches will also be accepted at this time).

In addition, the contractor will collect Christmas trees curbside on your regular rubbish collection day the week of January 13 to 17. All decorations, including tinsel, must be removed from the trees. Trees in plastic bags or not completely cleaned of this material will not be picked up or accepted at the Compost Area.

Please note that in order to use the Compost Area you will need a 2014 Community Access Sticker. For further information regarding the Community Access Sticker contact the Reading Police department at 781-944-1212.



School Fabric Collection




Have you wondered what those white bins at the school are?

These white bins are at every school in Reading. Residents can donate clothing and other textiles and Baystate Textiles pays the school department \$100 per ton. Baystate picks up the textiles three times a week and the school department not only gains the funds but it also saves the town money by not having to pay for disposal of items that would end up in the trash.

Recyclers will take the good, the bad, and the ugly. The only used textiles that can't be reused are those that are wet, mildewed, or loaded with hazardous waste. And the useful items include not only clothing but also old stuffed animals, faded curtains, and ratty towels and sheets. The program is ongoing and anyone can drop off textiles in the bins at any of the schools.
