Kitchen Aerator

(1.5 gpm)



The kitchen faucet aerator can reduce water flow to 1.5 gallons per minute.

Bath Aerator

(1.5 gpm)

The bathroom faucet aerator can reduce water flow to 1.5 gallons per minute.



Leak Detection Tabs



Add a dye tablet to the toilet tank and allow to dissolve. After 10-15 minutes, check the toilet bowl for colored water. If you see any, you have a leak.

Low Flow Shower Head



Water efficient showerheads use a maximum of 2.5 gallons per minute. An efficient showerhead can save an average of 25-40 gallons per shower.

Displacement Bag



For older toilets, the water displacement bag can save thousands of gallons of water per year by saving water with every flush.

Drip Gauge

A drip gauge is a tool to help you determine how much even a slow drip can add up to over time.



Garden Hose Nozzle



The garden hose nozzle will help you save water when watering outside.

The nozzle has an adjustable setting to help water properly.

Rain Gauge

The rain gauge will help you determine when your garden, flowers or lawn needs watering.



Irrigation Timer



The irrigation timer is attached to a garden hose to control how long you use a lawn sprinkler.
