ROAD CONSTRUCTION UPDATE



This spring the Town's Engineering Division, through its contractor Lazaro Paving Corporation, has either resurfaced or is in the process of resurfacing a total of 27 roadways. Currently the following roads have received the final layer of pavement and are awaiting the paving of driveway aprons and the loaming and seeding along the edge of the roadway where necessary:

- A Street (End to end)
- B Street (Libby Avenue to end (E))
- Bradford Road (Lowell Street to end)
- C Street (Libby Avenue to end)
- Crocus Lane (Libby Avenue to end)
- D Street (Libby Avenue to end (E))
- Dana Road (Charles Street to Small Lane)
- E Street (Libby Avenue to end (E))
- Heritage Drive (Libby Avenue to end)
- Howard Street (Sigsbee Street to County Road)
- Ivy Lane (Libby Avenue to end)
- Libby Avenue (Salem Street to end)
- Margaret Road (End to end)
- Parkman Road (Lowell Street to Margaret Rd.)
- Pleasant Street (Parker Street to end)
- Scout Hill Lane (Shady Hill Lane to end)
- Shady Hill Lane (Putnam Road to end)
- South Street (various sections)
- Sturges Road (South Street to Sturges Road)

The following roadways currently under construction and awaiting the final layer of pavement, which is expected to be completed within the next 2 weeks, include: Longview Road, Laneton Way and Palmer Hill Avenue.



In addition, roadways still scheduled to receive a new top coat of pavement within the next 2 weeks include: James Road, Sherwood Road, Whitehall Lane, and Pasture Road.

Later this summer, the Town will be micro-surfacing Ashley Place, Fairchild Drive, Jessica Circle, and Lindsay Lane. Micro-surfacing is the process where any cracks are sealed, and a new asphalt wearing surface is applied to the existing pavement. Residents will receive more notification of this prior to the work commencing on their street.

The Town is in the process of finalizing which streets will be included in resurfacing work to be completed this fall and next spring (2016). Please refer to the Engineering Division's webpage later this summer for an updated list of streets to be resurfaced in the future.

Real Estate Taxes... Water/Sewer... Storm Water Bills... Electronic Payments...



Water/Sewer/Storm Water bills were mailed on June 10 and must be paid by 5:30 PM on July 15 in order to receive the 10% discount. Payments not received by July 31 will accrue interest daily at an annual rate of 14% until payment is received. Postmarks are not accepted. The white mail box in the parking lot will be emptied at 5:30 PM on July 15 with no exceptions allowed so please plan ahead. The next bills will be mailed on September 10.

We can only accept debit and credit card payments through our online payment service and the link is available on the home page of the Town's website.

The first installment of the FY16 Preliminary Real Estate/Personal Property tax bills were mailed by June 30. Payment is due by August 3. The preliminary bills do not show either the valuation of the property or the tax rate; this information will be included on the actual tax bills after they are approved by the Department of Revenue in the late fall.

The preliminary bills are based on last year's actual bills, plus liens and betterments, less abatements and exemptions, as adjusted to reflect the annual 2.5% tax increase allowed under Proposition 2 1/2. The state mandated interest rate is 14% for late payments. The first installment of the FY16 Actual bills will be mailed in December. Payments not received by the due dates are subject to interest and demand fees.

The demand fee increased from \$5.00 to \$25.00 as of January 1, 2009 by vote of Town Meeting. **Effective January 1, 2014 we are no longer mailing payment reminders before imposing the demand fees on unpaid bills.**

Please be sure that if you're using an online bill payment service through your bank that you allow plenty of time for your bank to **mail** a check to our office. Most banks require 7 – 10 business days to guarantee on-time payment. Also, please verify that you have the proper bill number or account number referenced on your payment. Bill numbers change each cycle and are often not updated on your on-line bill payment checks.

We do not receive electronic payments from your bank unless you use the link from our website. If you choose to use this link, you may pay up until the due date and your payment will be considered timely.



Reading Response Program

The Reading Response Program is designed to assist in meeting health needs of the residents of Reading. The program is offered and funded by the Town of Reading's Hospital Trust Funds and is administered by Hallmark Health Visiting Nurse Association and Hospice.

The Program may provide needed health services or complement existing services on a no cost basis if the resident meets eligibility requirements.

Reading residents of all ages whose income qualifies them are eligible to receive the following services:

- ◆ Lifeline Emergency Response System
- ◆ *Lifeline Medication Management System
- ◆ *Home Care Aide Escort
(HCA escort will travel to medical procedures with prior approval)
- ◆ Taxi or Chair Car Transportation for medical appointments throughout the Boston Area

You already know that you can recycle paper and cardboard, glass and metal, and plastics 1-7, but you can now add milk and juice cartons, aluminum, pizza boxes, and empty non-hazardous aerosol cans.

Help Keep Our Stormwater Clean

Please help keep the Town of Reading’s stormwater system clean. Our stormwater system consists of grated catchbasins in our roads, streams and wetlands. Stormwater (rain and snow melt) is untreated and can carry pollutants into streams and wetlands. This means by polluting our catchbasins and streams we are directly polluting the town’s three rivers (*Ipswich, Aberjona, and Saugus*) that eventually lead to the ocean.

Stormwater pollution can also impact our groundwater, wetlands and waterways eventually contaminating our drinking water, fish, and wildlife. By keeping our stormwater system uncontaminated, we can help keep the environment clean for generations to come.

Here are some ways homeowners can help:

- Never dump household waste such as paint, cleaning products, motor oils, antifreeze, yard waste or any other hazardous material into catch basins, streams or wetlands
- Promptly repair oil and fluid leaks on your vehicle
- Use environmentally friendly, biodegradable products when cleaning outside
- Remove debris such as trash, leaves and grass clipping away from catchbasins, streams or wetlands
- Minimize the use of fertilizers near catchbasins, streams or wetlands
- Always pick up and dispose of pet waste properly in trash, do **not** leave on the ground or dump in the town’s grated catchbasins


Please note that the Stormwater fee for single & two-family residences is \$10.00/per quarter (\$40.00 annually). Multi-family, commercial/industrial property fees will be based on total impervious surface area.
